Dear Speaker Phillip,

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Happy Thanksgiving! With that I wish to extend warm greetings to you and the members of the 13th Kosrae State Legislature. I am transmitting, enclosed herewith, for your review and favorable actions a proposed bill to amend S.L. No. 13-37- the FY2024 budget law.

As you are aware, due to the delayed action by the U.S. Congress in passing the 2023 Amended Compact, the US Congress approved a continuing resolution allowing for provisional funding to the FSM Government, by which \$1,309,435.45 was allocated to the State of Kosrae. Please find attached copies of the grant awards allocating the \$1.3M, with the following breakdown:

Education

 + \$672,792

 Health

 Enhance Reporting & Accountability
 - \$545,459.74

 Enhance Reporting & Accountability

You may note that because of the limited funding under the continuing resolution priority was given to the operation of the sector funded entities, mainly for personnel and essential services. PMO is one of the entities; however, it has operational funding extended (carried-over) from the previous year budget that is enough to cover its first quarter budget.

Aside from the amended compact sector funds, there are also necessary adjustments to the state revenue fund and the foreign assistance funds columns of the budget law. These amendments are as explained below:

"WORKING TOGETHER FOR THE WELLBEING OF OUR PEOPLE AND KOSRAE"

- 1. Governor's Office increase personnel by \$4,312 to include one quarter budget for the Governor's Special Assistance (Special Project) position.
- 2. AG's Office increase personnel by \$275, adjustment to one quarter budget.
- 3. Dept. of Admin & Finance reduce personnel by \$29,683 from Revenue, which added to the Amended Compact Fund column, based on grant award from the CR. Contractual budget \$500 under Revenue Fund column to compensate the Ad-Hoc Committee meeting allowance. Others budget reduced to \$3,000, diverting most of the department's others budget to the Amended Compact funding under the ERA (Enhance Reporting and Accountability) project. The Fixed Assets reduced to \$35,000 in the Foreign Assistance Fund column reflecting budget for equipments and vehicle budget under the Amended Compact Fund and the Revenue Fund.
- 4. Broadcast the increases under the authority reflects previous amendments to S.L. No. 12-190, as amended in S.L. No. 13-38. As we all know the S.L. No. 13-38 amends a budget law that is already been lapsed, which void the intension of the proposal.

These amendments are reflected in the excel worksheet attached to this communication.

We have just received the grant awards for our sector assistance under the continuing resolution, and we are expecting another continuing resolution that will provide additional funding up to early months of 2024. Your Department of Finance will work closely with the national government on the state's allocation under the second continuing resolution. Once we receive the grant awards for the new continuing resolution, I will transmit it for your appropriate actions.
